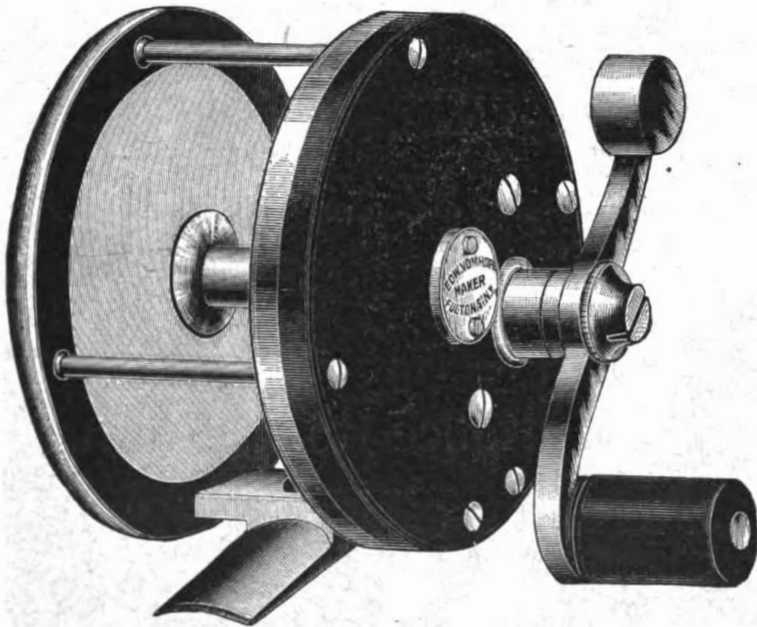

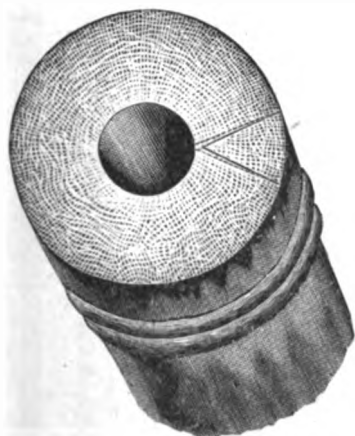

Hexangular and Septangular Split Bamboo Rods.

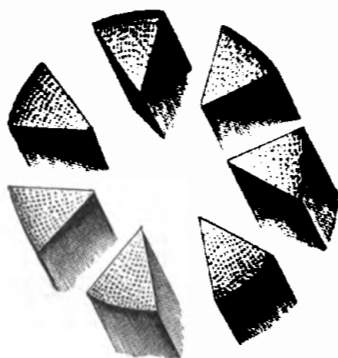
Split Bamboo Rods are so widely known throughout the country that it seems to call your special attention as to their points and qualities.

Hexagonal Split Bamboo Rods are principally the only kind made by all makers, and in order to introduce the same the result is that the market is stocked with Rods of this class, which are in many cases little better than none at all; causing so many anglers to become prejudiced against Split Bamboo Rods.

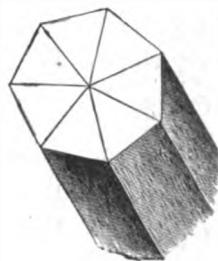
The Hexagonal and Septangular Split Bamboo Rods are both made by me, and of the latter I am the ONLY manufacturer. The great advantage lies in the fact that in a seven strip Rod we get a more perfect round Rod than in any other, for the reason that all sides and corners are even.—(See cut.)

No. 1, shows a transverse section of Bamboo Cane, and the dotted lines where a piece has been split out.

No. 2, the shaded part shows the strip for cementing.

No. 3, shows the shape of a joint when the strips are cemented.

We know and have reason to believe that the first class Fly and Bait Rods of all makes can be bent to a circle so that the Tip will touch the Butt and not break. When necessary it will be time enough to test your Rods, and don't ruin the same in this manner, as in some cases Anglers will show to their friends the strength of the Rods and what it can do without breaking. Anglers know, or should know, that such a treatment will be injurious to a Rod, and one forever trying to find out the strength of his Rod is not worthy of a good Rod.

As to the selection of Bamboo, my long experience in handling the same should be a guarantee that none but the best material is used. They are hand made, with superior metal work, also accurate fitting of shouldered waterproof ferrules, and special care is given to the proper balancing of all Rods.

I claim these Rods to surpass any other in the market for spring, strength and durability. (Rods of any description made to order.)

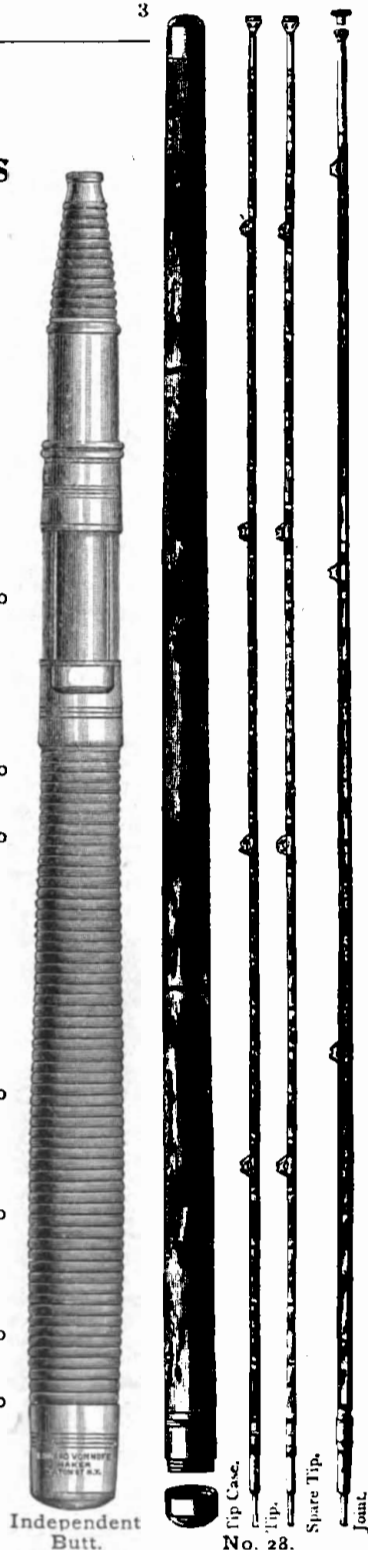

The Independent Butt, 18 inches long, Cane or Cork Wound, Standard Reel Seats, Waterproof Dowels, was first introduced by MR. E. VOM HOFÉ, and of which I make Four (4) Standard sizes, viz. Trout or Bass, Nos. 4, 5 and 6. The advantages of these Butts to Anglers are:

First, That they are almost indestructible.

Second, That Rods of various description, Split Bamboo, Greenheart, Bethabara, Lancewood, Calcutta Bamboo, in one piece or jointed, are made to fit the number of Butt.

Third, That a Rod may be left at various Fishing resorts, leaving only the Butt to carry.

Fourth, That the Angler is required to send on the number of the Butt only, to have a new Rod replaced.

Fifth, That Rods of any length, weight and quality can be applied to the same.

The smallest are used for Trout or Bass Fly and Bait; the No. 4 for light salt water and lake trolling; Nos. 5 and 6 for Striped Bass or heavy trolling Rods; No. 6 principally for Tarpon Rods.

A few Remarks to Amateurs.

THE TROUT.

Pages upon pages have been written concerning this speckled beauty of the finny tribe, poems have been sung in its praise, and much more without doubt will be written describing the different species. It is not my purpose to extol his beauty, but simply to present a few suggestions to my patrons as to the best mode, whereby they will have the opportunity to study for themselves through his capture, the brightness of his color, and his justly won title of "a fighting king." It is not out of place, however, to make mention of those places where he is most likely to be found. If you are after brook trout, look for them in streams among the wild-wood where they twist and turn, twirl and double, and are overshadowed by bush and fallen trees, in deep holes, where never penetrates the light of the sun, where during the long summer days the waters are icy cold, abounding in cresses and water moss, those are the best places to look for the trout in all their beauty and pride.

A few words now as to tackle which in no case should be heavy. It possesses no special advantages except perhaps to permit the angler to land the trout faster, if biting rapidly, but this is counterbalanced by the disadvantages attending its use in the difficulty experienced in casting, not to mention the continual hanging up of your fish in the overhanging branches of trees.—*Select your rod from Pages 2, 5, 6, 7, 8 and 9.*

Use an enameled tapered, water-proof silk line—*See Pages 45 and 46*—and always have a good reel.—*See Pages 24 to 29 and 33.*—Order some leaders and a few good flies. Never use cheap tackle because it is cheap, as it invariably proves the dearest in the long run. Angling in perfection lies in the use of flies—its pleasures, in anticipating the splendid rises you are going to have—the big trout you are going to catch. The trout are fastidious, and require different flies at different times, one day the grizzly king being the favorite, at another time, perhaps the coachman, again the professor, and sometimes they will rise at nothing less than the brown or red hackles, the white miller being successfully used with the coming twilight. The same flies are not taking ones in different localities, and this fact has been demonstrated.—*Refer to Page 65 for Standard Flies.*

In starting take along a number of pronounced colors, about half a dozen will answer, and soon the angler will learn the most suitable flies for the waters fished in.

If deep trolling for lake trout, use a stiff rod, *No. 42, 204, 125, also see Pages 10 and 13.* A multiplying reel, *No. 1/10 to 3/10* holding 200 yards of braided silk or linen line, leaders of best silk worm gut, six foot in length, tying two swivels between them. If surface trolling, use a light sinker and light bait rod.—*No. 22, 28, 15 and 8, also see Pages 8 and 10.* Fasten a minnow gang to the end of your line and your tackle will be complete.—*For Minnow Gangs refer to page 61.*

THE BLACK BASS.

There are two species of this gamy fish, the small mouth, and the large mouth, the latter sometimes known as the Oswego Bass. Those weighing from two to three and one half pounds generally give more sport in catching than those of greater weight.

In casting for bass, use a light rod—*Refer to Pages 2 to 10*—a click reel—*Refer to Pages 24 to 29*—to hold fifty yards of braided silk taper line, waterproofed, six to nine foot leaders, with loops to attach dropper flies. Use one or two flies, drop them gently, near a small eddy if possible, if fishing in stream, permitting them to sink well under water, then draw slowly across the current, at the foot of little reaches, where the water runs swift, and the surface ruffled.

Cast inshore, where the stronger currents have worn a deeper channel, and whip the deeper pools where the water rests on its way out to sea. Trolling with flies is an easy way of taking bass, use one hundred to two hundred feet of line, to the end of which a gut leader, six to nine feet long with loops for attaching or detaching dropper flies, is attached, one swivel should be used where the leader joins the reel line, and another midway in the leader. No more than three flies at one time should be used, which must be larger and brighter in color than those used in casting. Yellow, combined with black, white, red and with a little green, are

considered to be very killing. Troll along shore early in the season over shoals and sunken reefs, and as it is not easy to handle one or more bass at the end of 100 feet of line, and save the fish, it is desirable to keep your line taut and your boat in motion. In August the bass seek deeper water, then add one or two buckshot to your leader, allowing the flies to sink down to the fine grass of the bottom, rowing more slowly than for surface trolling. When a spoon or gang is used, a heavier rod is required, *Rod No. 22, 28 15 and 8, also see Pages 10 and 11.* In still fishing a fly rod is used with five minnows for bait, as also crawfish, helgamites, frogs, crickets, grasshoppers, small perch and suckers. Minnows are hooked under the dorsal fin or through the lips; the crawfish, through the tail from underneath upward; frogs, through the lips, or legs; crickets, under the "throat latch;" grasshoppers, through the body, lengthwise or crosswise; helgamites, through the body, lengthwise. In all cases, however, the best bait to use is that kind with which the bass are most familiar, as the poorest native bait surpasses any other. A capital plan, when fishing the same pond or stream several successive days, is to bait certain places, by dropping in the water one day, where you expect to fish the next, injured or dead crawfish. The bass then seem to keep around, particularly is this the case in the fall of the year. Landing nets—*See Page 89*—for black bass, should have a large mesh, and made of fine twine. Do not attempt to bring bass to the net until he is exhausted, as the final flop often proves fatal towards securing your fish.

THE STRIPED BASS.

The striped bass varies in size from eight or ten inches of small ones up to as high as sixty-two. Those weighing three or four pounds run together in companies, and are therefore known as "school bass," and these are the kind that afford such excellent sport to anglers, the larger ones are taken with the rod and reel along the sandy and rocky shores of the Atlantic Coast just outside the breakers and at inlets.

The "run" of bass commences in the spring, the capturing of "school bass" continuing all summer, and the latter part of August surf fishing is in vogue. In the strong, sweeping tides of clear, deep waters is the best place to look for him, and there you will find him in perfection. When fishing for bass use a rod.—*See Pages 4, 5, 10, 11 to 13—Multiplying Reels from $\frac{1}{10}$ to $\frac{4}{10}$. See Pages 36 to 44.*

The line should be of linen, and three to six hundred feet in length will not be too much on your reel—sinks gauged according to the water's force and to keep the line four or five feet from the bottom—a leader of double or twisted gut arranged for two hooks—this leader should be four feet in length. Have the tyings made as neat as possible, as the striped bass is a wary customer. Shedder crab for bait is tempting, but is easily washed from the hooks. Another and good kind of bait is the long sandworm, which, if arranged on the hook so as to make it squirm, proves a most taking lure. In trolling, the tail of the squid is used frequently with heavy tackle. The months of June, July and August are the best for trolling, and along sedge-covered banks, about sunken meadows, and the swift race-ways of the tides, are the places the bass most frequent, and just before and after the tide changes is the best time to take them. Fly fishing for striped bass is exciting sport as they take the fly eagerly—the top of the flood, a little before the turn of the tide being the right time—use a large bright fly. In surf fishing for the striped bass the very best of tackle must be used. A rod *No. 43, 201, 400, 402, 405, 420, 368 to 455*, the reel of larger size, perfectly balanced—*See Pages 48 to 49*—the line, say six hundred feet, of the best linen make—*See Pages 38, 42 to 44.*

These items should be well looked to as they are indispensable in casting, and the longest cast brings in the most and largest fish. While you are preparing to do your casting, the "chummer" has cut up into pieces a bushel basket full of menhaden, and scatters them over the waves. The menhaden is in favor with the bass, and the oil covers the water for some distance out. Use on your hook a big piece of crab or an entire lobster's tail, make your cast as far as possible, and the excitement of your fishing commences, and you will have opportunity enough to use your head as well as hand in landing your fish. August and September are the best months for surf fishing.

THE WEAKFISH.

The weakfish is considered by some, as the most beautiful specimen of fish that is taken from salt waters, and although he does not possess the game qualities as the striped bass, his capture affords much sport to many anglers. During the summer and early fall months they run in large numbers; July, August and Sep-

tember being the best time to take them. Their weight varies from two to eighteen pounds. They are generally fished for from an anchored boat in the tideway, the best stage being the flood tide, more especially the last half of it. The most sport is afforded with a light bamboo rod.—See Pages 4, 5, 10, 11 to 13.

A large reel from $\frac{1}{2}$ to $\frac{3}{4}$ should be used, the same as in fishing for small striped bass, with a fine twisted linen line,—See Pages 36 to 44—light as may be consistent with strength, to which attach a light swivel sinker and a leader, with two large hooks. A good hook is the Sproat, Carlisle, American Trout, O'Shaughnessy—See Illustrations.

The shedder crab is the best bait, but other good kinds are hard clams, shrimp, a piece of menhaden, or some other fish of light color.

If fishing for the smaller weakfish, make your cast, allowing the sinker to remain three or four feet from the bottom, but if in the tideway for larger fish, a float should be used, so arranged as to hold the bait five or six feet below the surface. The weakfish is a brave fighter and a fierce biter, generally running the line faster than it can be reeled off, in other words, to over run it, and so shake out the hooks, as his jaws are parchment like, easily torn, the hook being stayed by the stiff rim of mouth, it is well therefore to keep your line taut while fishing for the weakfish

THE BLUEFISH.

Early in the spring months the run of this most destructive of all the coast fishes commences, lasting throughout the entire summer and fall seasons, disappearing altogether with the advent of winter. It is during these annual visits, that his destructiveness is manifested by the havoc created among the smaller fishes, slaughtering them as he does, apparently for the fun of it, by the billions. They do not devour one-tenth of a part of their victims, generally taking but one clean bite out of each fish, leaving the balance for the gulls. The fishermen know when they see these birds sailing and dipping, that the bluefish are about, so through their own murderous work, do they point the way toward their own destruction. Bluefish are taken in various ways—trolling with hand lines, which requires a good stout cotton line, some three hundred feet long, to which is attached a heavy sinker, and below that an ivory bone or metal trolling spoon, attached to the line by a yard long wire snell, sometimes a trolling sinker, made with a large hook set in lead is used. There are a variety of spoons, the most costly being manufactured from silver and pearl.

Woolen gloves should be worn as a protection for the hands, as when the bluefish strikes, he does so fiercely and commences right there a hard fight, running deep at one time, then breaking on the surface, and at times surging from side to side. (*For Tackle use same as in Striped Bass Fishing.*)

Chumming is another excellent way of taking bluefish—when a rod is used, which must have large free guides, a free running reel and light swivel sinker. Chop moss bunkers into fine pieces, strewing them over the waters, as if fishing for striped bass. A piece of menhaden or crab for bait, is cast out among the chum bait, and reeled in taking care to always have the hooks affixed to your line by gimp, snell or piece of fine wire. This fish is sometimes taken with flies of the large kind, of bright and assorted colors. The rising tide, and slack water at the ebb and flood is the best time to try for the bluefish, and along the Jersey coast excellent fishing is to be found.

THE SHEEPSHEAD.

Many people consider the sheepshead the greatest delicacy among all the sea fishes. Everyone must acknowledge his flavor to be most excellent. Taken altogether, he is one of those variety, beautiful in color, and very toothsome, which only the salt water can produce. They run in size from one-half to fifteen pounds, and similar to other fishes of the coast, appears only in summer, arriving in June and departing in November.

Sheepshead are taken with rod and reel, and being a shy fish it requires some skill as well as patience to lure him from his native element.

The rod should be a stout one, the regular striped bass rod being about right.

A small but strong braided linen line, to which attach a swivel and tracing sinker, and a double gut leader, made of two parts, one of two feet and the other one foot in length. Soft clams put on whole or without shell, is the first best bait, the second best, the shedder crab and fiddler crab. Use hooks made of stout wire and short shank.

A multiplier reel should be used, of the size used in fishing for bass. Permit the sinker to find bottom after making your cast, then draw the line taut, which enables you to feel the slightest nibble. Once on the hook, the sheepshead will come to the surface without much trouble, when he will often drop like a flash out of sight again. A landing net is quite an important part of the angler's outfit, the sheepshead being heavily armored with scales.

THE TARPON.

This mighty game fish, in weight running up into the hundreds, was comparatively unknown to Anglers not very many years ago, at which time the taking of the Tarpon with rod and reel was an unheard of exploit, the difficulty experienced in handling him on a rod, exceeding that of any other fish, requiring more power, not excepting the Salmon. Of recent years the interest in fishing for the Tarpon has increased to a marked degree, but even now his capture with the rod and line is not of frequent occurrence, and that Angler who proves himself so skillful or fortunate enough to take one of these silver kings in that manner, can well consider that he has achieved a no ordinary task. As a vaulting fish they are not excelled by anything that swims the seas, instances being known where they have cleared the waters with their tails to a height equaling four feet; they are rapid in their movements, and their strength is somewhat enormous. Generally after taking the bait, they instantly jump in the air close to the boat, at other times dashing away rapidly for a great distance before commencing their jumping antics; while in the air they shake their heads, thus ejecting the bait which they have been holding in their mouths. The usual kind of bait is the mullet, of which a portion and sometimes a whole one is used; they have been taken with minnows, and spoon bait has been tried. They take the bait near the surface generally, and sometimes on the bottom. The tackle used in their capture is of varied devices, but I would recommend from my own personal experience in fishing for the Tarpon, the following kinds: *For Rod Nos. 43, 420 and 455—For Reels see Pages 38, 42 to 44—Lines see Page 40—Hooks see Page 61.*

For further particulars as to the habits of this particular kind of game fish, I would refer my patrons to the recently published book, which is devoted solely to the description, capture, etc., of the Tarpon.

THE MUSCALLONGE.

During the summer months, the muscallonge is not generally found in deep clear waters, where there is no vegetable matter, at least he is not often taken in such, neither does he care particularly for a swift current, though occasionally some fine specimens have been taken in a stream not over three feet in depth, running very swiftly. The best places to look for him, are in those lakes and rivers which abound in aqueous plants. They attain in some instances a remarkable size, and it requires strong tackle to capture them. The lure bait and tackle used are of various kinds, but the majority of all captured muscallonge are taken with the old-fashioned trolling spoon. A strong braided line, from fifty to one hundred yards long, though generally the actual use will not exceed thirty yards, a copper or silver spoon mounted on strong wire, with three strong hooks. Some anglers use only one or two hooks, but the triangle seems to be the surest. This manner of trolling proves as effective as any other in open waters where there are no interfering weeds. Late in the season, when the vegetation is full grown, it is a good plan to have your boat rowed outside of the weed bank at some distance, and use a strong rod—*Nos. 42, 201, 125 also see Page 13—Rods from Nos. 350 to 368—Multiplying Reels, size from No. 1/10 to 4/10.*

Whether the line is used with or without a rod, one swivel, two if necessary, should be placed about ten feet from the hooks, a two ounce sinker, double cone in shape, with a hole through its length, should be placed upon this piece of line.

More real sport can be enjoyed, when a rod is used than by a hand line. They will take almost any kind of bait, from the common spoon to pieces of red flannel and white cotton cloth, being of such a voracious nature, that they will strike at anything almost which happens their way. Of live bait the young herring, large silver shiners and frogs prove very attractive.

It is not well, under any circumstances to hurry this fish after hooking, if you desire to make his capture

sure, and after landing, which should be accomplished with the assistance of a gaff, do not attempt to remove the hook from his mouth while alive, as his strength is enormous, and your hands would suffer in consequence.

The best season for muscallonge is from July to September, and on days when a north or east wind prevails, it proves of little use to troll for them.

THE SALMON.

A writer well-known by name to all anglers and personally to many of the fraternity, has truthfully pictured this royal fish in the following words: "To the ardent angler what living creature can be imagined more beautiful than a shapely June Salmon, just in from salt water, disporting in the refreshing element of his native river, and exultant in his escape from all the besetting dangers he has run, from feeble parrhood to full maturity of growth and strength." There are certainly few sights more beautiful and fascinating to admirers of these denizens of the water. Salmon rarely take to the fly in salt water, only occasional instances being on record, but it is not unusual to take them with bait. Expert anglers for salmon are a rarity, it really being an art to capture them. Those who are considered the best of trout fishermen, are not successful salmon anglers at their first attempt. It is no easy matter to discriminate the proper pools or rapids to thresh, and though his fly is skittered skillfully over the surface, it meets without reward. Contrary to the habits of the trout, salmon almost invariably takes the fly submerged. Anglers should cast straight for the tail of a pool when casting, for seldom do the fish lie elsewhere, then impart to your fly the motions made by shrimp on the water, not in too spasmodic a way, moving the top of your rod laterally every few seconds some three feet or more. Salmon take the fly very quietly and should not be hooked too quickly; while in trout fishing it is customary to strike at a rise, in fishing for salmon, such a mode will most certainly cause the loss of your fish—tighten your line just a little at the proper time, then your fish will be hooked properly. Cast immediately in some other spot if a salmon rises once to a fly and misses, allowing a full minute before making the second trial. The moment you find your fish fast, raise your rod to a perpendicular, and keep it in that position, unless the salmon leaps from the water, in which case dip the tip at once. Generally the ways of a hooked salmon are a series of short runs, and circular sweeps, as a rule making for the upper streams, which is kept up until he tires, when he is reeled in at once and brought to gaff.

The proper tackle required for salmon fishing is a rod from 14 to 16 feet long—*See Pages 3 and 11.*

The reel, a combination one of rubber and German Silver—*See Pages 30 to 32.*

Use a waterproof line—*See Pages 45 and 46.*

For flies see Page 67.—Yellow mohair and golden pheasant are preferable for early rivers.

THE CHANNEL BASS.

Among the game fishes found in southern waters, the red or channel bass takes high rank, being a valiant fighter when one fairly hooked, not to be brought to gaff until utter exhaustion compels him to give up the unequal struggle. They run in weight from one to forty pounds, some having been taken on rod and reel, weighing as much as fifty pounds.

The places where he is most likely to be found, are along marshy shores, in deep channels, around oyster beds, and over mud flats, frequenting these various spots, during different stages of the tide.

Occasionally very large ones are captured off the Jersey coast, where they are known as the red drum. That kind of tackle used for striped bass fishing, answers almost the same purpose for the channel bass, except in the case of sinkers and delicate lines or gut, the latter being apt to be destroyed by the sharp oyster shells.

Hard crab for bait is a good one, as also the mullet, and they will also take the artificial bait, greedily taking a spinner or fly.

They can be fished for on the bottom, by casting and reeling in your bait, or with a float and with a suitable spinner; trolling with rod and reel, or hand line, at the commencement of the flood, the best of sport can be enjoyed.

Fly fishing for the medium sized bass in Florida waters, will prove a revelation to many anglers, who are yet unacquainted with this mode of taking the channel bass.

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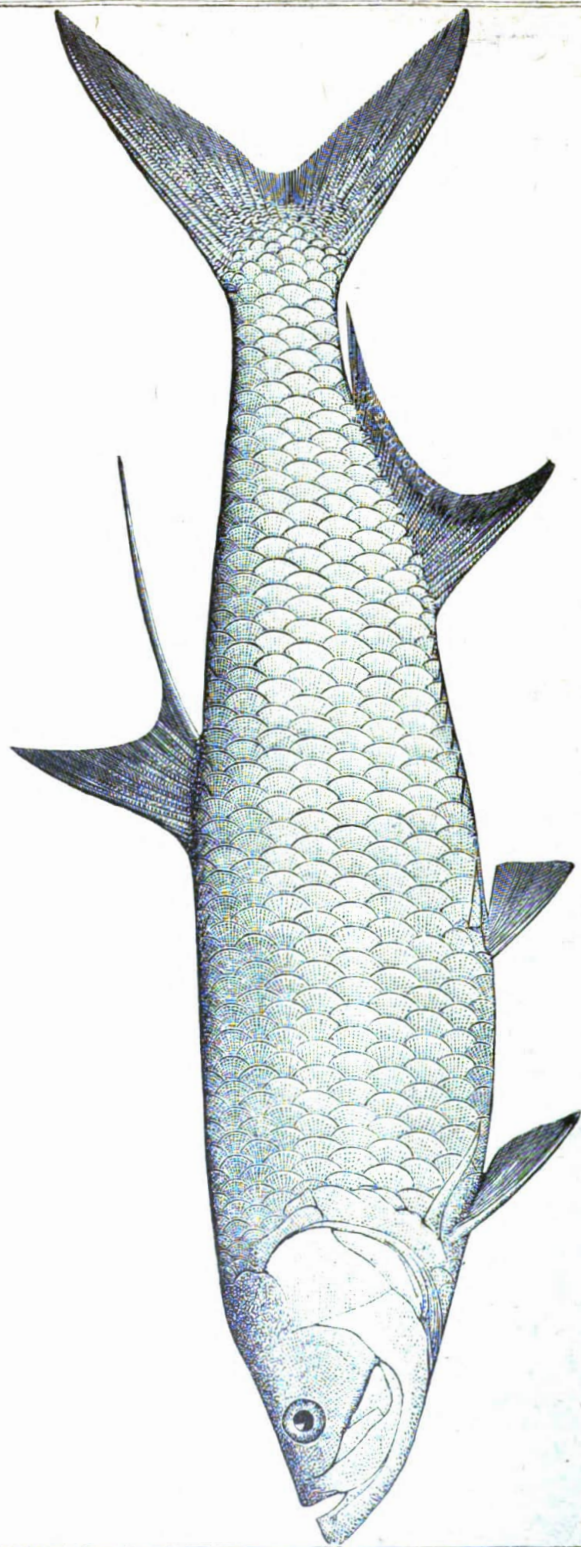
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
