

# A Word From Weirton.

## **MEET & SHOW REVIEW**

## FLORIDA ANTIQUE TACKLE COLLECTORS Ft. Myers, FL Show and Auction — November 10 — 11, 1990

Our arrival in Ft. Myers began on an ominous note. Having promised my wife a weekend of shopping in neighboring Naples (30 miles south) if she accompanied me, imagine my horror (and my wife's frowning face) when we discovered at the airport that none of the half-dozen rental car agencies had any cars left! Thoughts of reel opportunities lost to round-trip cab fare charges soon vanished, however, when I found a Volkswagen Golf at the local Rent-A-Wreck. Since it was the last rental car available in southwest Florida, I knew things were looking up.

And were they ever! Fred Kerr and Jim Supej proved to be top-rate hosts (though I must admit, Fred's wife and daughter seemed to do most of the work) and two of the nicest guys I've had the pleasure of meeting while collecting tackle. Club President Ron Gast displayed one of the finest Kentucky reel collections in the world. If you didn't salivate when you walked by his table, perhaps ORCA should refund your money. Maybe this can be our initiation test.

The 65 members (of approximately 300) and 125 guests who attended the show and auction also got to see Ed Pritchard's fantastic big game reel collection. Ed hails from Homestead, Florida, and covets the Fin-Nor, Knolles, Stevens and Lees mammoth reels made over the years in Miami. He also had several classic Arthur Kovalovsky and Ed vom Hofe models. No matter what size reels you collect, one had to admire the craftsmanship of those big boys.

With widely-traveled Brian McGrath, editor and publisher of Fishing Collectibles Magazine at my side providing moral support (some would call it "egging on"), yours truly negotiated the private purchase of a J.L. Sage, Frankfort, Ky, brass No. 2; a J.L. Sage, brass No. 5; and a B.C. Milam Frankfort, KY No. 1. Ouch! Brian even bought me a cheeseburger after the deal to calm my 240-lb body!

The most unusual part of the show was the auction. The FATC "flushes out" high quality tackle from nonmembers by its active solicitation and advertising. Even

## REEL LIFE IN THE N.F.L.C.C.

All too frequently, we reel collectors are skunked at N.F.L.C.C. regional meets, frustrated by the overwhelming preponderance of lures that we encounter. That was not the case at the club's Region 2 Meet held in Allentown, Pa., on Nov. 16-17, 1990, and hosted by Dave Hartranft. The 113 tables bore a healthy mix of old tackle, fishing ephemera, art, books, and paper. Although it seemed that everyone at the meet could have gone home with an ABU or two (a disturbing development), there were enough older reels to hold anyone's interest. Only big-game reels were in short supply.

Among the reel highlights was Mal McCarty's gorgeous exhibit of Winchester tackle, which featured the biggest display of their reels I've ever seen. Their reels are much more impressive when grouped in such fashion. Some of the scarcer reels seen at the Meet were: Redifor B, Redifor X, Atwood, Henshall-Van Antwerp, a couple of Milams, Meek 44, Hendryx Populo, a Redifor with a Redifor Spooler, Heddon 4-18, Heddon 4-15, Clinton, an unusual, unmarked cage reel, and an especially beautiful J. vom Hofe salmon reel. How many of these reels changed hands and at what prices are open questions. Whet anyone's appetite?

local churches are sent notices. One retiree who brought in a box of reels on Sunday for the auction walked out a few hours later with check for nearly \$9,000.00 and a big smile on his face. Also, all members are given equal access to these treasures, and "parking lot pirates" are not tolerated.

The only downside of the meet was the absence of inroom trading to the extent normally seen at NFLCC meets. Also, the Florida salt air has a strange oxidation effect on the german silver parts of reels. German silver contains copper, which, when oxidized, leaves a strange bronze glow on the reel. Old timers recommend a touch of lemon juice to solve the dilemna.
