

A special point of excellence in the Talbot is its perfect action and balance. This enables the angler to make casts of any possible length with a minimum of liability to an overrun—that bane of the balt caster's existence.

HE utmost care is used in the selection of materials and the workmanship is as perfect as it is possible for human hands and tools to devise. No other reel can begin to compare with it for artistic design and finish throughout. But the one thing which alone is sufficient to place the Talbot in a class above all others is the gear. This is so made that it is absolutely noiseless in operation and delightfully smooth and easy to the touch. When for cleaning or oiling or any other reason it is necessary to take the Talbot Reel apart, it may be done by removing only three screws. All other makes require the removal of five screws. In the Talbot the three bars come up through the cap, thus lending greater stability to the entire reel while reducing the number of parts to a minimum. In short, it is the very best reel that can be built for any price, and better


Details of Construction

PINIONS, STUDS AND PIVOTS—Stubbs English steel carefully hardened and oil tempered.

WHEELS—Made in one piece from hard drawn aluminum bronze rods.

RODS—Hard drawn and thoroughly tested German silver.

Wherever sheet metal is used, the very best hard rolled material is carefully selected and warranted free from defects. Wheels and pinions are cut spiral and fitted with extreme care and accuracy. Reels will be finished in sterling silver, German silver or brass, as ordered. Longer or shorter spools will be made to order. All reels are quadruple multiplying, and have spiral gears. Degree of accuracy one-thousandth of a centimetre.





Dear Sir—For the benefit of the angling fraternity it would be well to give the history in detail of two bait casting reels, sizes No. 2 and 3, that you made for me of aluminum after my own specifications, and of some in duplicate that you made at the same time for friends, but space will not permit; consequently, I will only mention in brief a few absolute facts concerning them. After a firm which CLAIMS to make the best Kentucky reel, agreed to do the work but failed in the attempt in about six months and then acknowledged their utter inability to do it, you at once, without hesitation, undertook the contract and in a very reasonable time completed it, to the entire satisfaction of all concerned. The workmanship and finish of these reels was perfect in every particular, and the opinion of an expert watch and chronometer jeweler, late of the Waltham Watch Co., who examined them for me, was that they were as accurate and well finished as a Jurgensen watch. This last season mine have been used constantly and have landed large lake trout, landlocked salmon, several brook trout and some hundreds of large mouth black bass. All taken casting artificial lures or live bait from the reel. Many of these last named fish were over five pounds. Some six pounds and one of seven and one-half pounds. The last mentioned fish is now mounted and may be seen any time at my home. The great advantage of the Talbot bait casting reels over those of other makers that I have tried—and I have experimented with all of the better class of reels made in America, as well as some of foreign manufacture—is their remarkable ability to allow casting an extremely light weight lure; a weight less than one-fourth ounce may be easily cast over one hundred feet with these reels, and a slightly heavier weight may be cast almost any distance. Levison Sliding or Traveling Float

There have been sliding floats on the market for many years, but until this one, with the addition of the ivory guide at the top of tube, was perfected by Mr. C. G. Levison, there were none of practical value. They were so constructed that contact with the rod tip released them, which necessitated resetting them in place each time the line was reeled in, or else the tubes through them were so large that a knot or lashing on the line that would stop the line sliding through the float could not glide easily through the rod guides and be wound on the reel, therefore useless for the purpose intended. To fish with this float, a small winding of waxed silk is placed around the line and knotted. Must be rather tightly wound, yet loose enough to be pushed by the fingers up or down the line according to fishing depth change. After knotting the silk winding, pass end of line through ivory guide and the tubing, adjust lead, hook or artificial lure, and all is complete. It may be seen that any depth of fishing may be had by simply adjusting the winding, as the winding will easily reel up. The advantages in this float will be readily seen. As the float rests on the lead more accuracy in casting; the bait settles where the float strikes the water; there is less chance of hanging up and the bait will not settle on one side and the float on the other side of a log.


